Active Duty, Guard, Reserve, Retirees, DoD Civilians, and Eligible Family Members are encouraged to attend this FREE event.</p>
<p align="center"><b>Capstone Event</b> 6 &amp; 20 July 2018, 0900-1100</p>	<p>The final step of TAP is the Capstone Event which should be accomplished <b>not later than 90 days before separation/retirement</b>. The Capstone Event is a one-on-one meeting with A&amp;FRF staff to verify completion of Career Readiness Standards (CRS). All separating/retiring service members on Title 10 orders for 180 (or more) consecutive days are required to meet all CRS.</p>
<p align="center"><b>Transition GPS (TAP) Workshop</b> 9-13 July 2018, 0800-1600 (Room 120)</p>	<p><b>Step 2 of TAP</b> is the five-day Transition GPS Workshop. The Transition GPS curriculum helps transitioning Service members meet the mandatory Career Readiness Standards (CRS). Spouses are welcome and encouraged to attend. Participants should wear casual civilian business attire and bring their laptop or tablet. TAP is mandatory for all separating/retiring Service members on Title 10 orders for 180 (or more) consecutive days. <b>Preseparation Counseling must be completed before attending the TAP Workshop.</b></p>

Family members are encouraged to attend.</p>

The purpose is to ensure Service members are informed of the services and benefits available to assist them and their families with the transition to civilian life. Spouses are welcome and encouraged to attend. Preseparation Counseling must be completed before attending the Transition GPS Workshop.</p>
